P R E F A C E.

THIS work is the result of the following resolution, unanimously adopted by the Assembly at Dukinfield, on the 20th June, 1895, the mover being the Rev. PHILIP MARTINEAU HIGGINSON, M.A., and the seconder, the Rev. GEORGE VANCE SMITH, B.A., Ph.D., D.D. :—

"That the Provincial Assembly undertake the printing, in a quarto volume, of complete lists, prepared by the Widows' Fund, of the congregations on the roll of the Assembly, with their ministers, adding biographical details, at an outlay of not more than £65., to be recovered, as far as possible, by sales."

Having compiled these lists at the request of the Widows' Fund Committee, the Assembly desired me to see them through the press, and to add any further details which might seem desirable.

The list of registers is taken from the Blue Book of 1841.

The topography, of some printed and other accounts of the various congregations, explains itself.

Most of the Communion plate has passed under my personal inspection. It is to be regretted that the list is not quite complete, mainly owing to my inability to see all the vessels, and to the fact that, in a very small number of cases, application for particulars has brought little or no response. A few congregations have no vessels.

The plate at Platt Chapel is the oldest in the Assembly, and is in all probability the original silver from Birch Chapel.

The Assembly and myself are indebted to no one more than to the Rev. ALX: GORDON, M.A., for the time and help so freely given over this work. All the sheets have passed through his hands.

My thanks are also heartily tendered to the Rev. Dr. MARTINEAU for information on many points; to my old school-fellow, WALTER J. EVANS, M.A., the Principal of the Presbyterian College, Caermarthen, for details pertaining to many of its *alumni*; to all others who have helped in many and different ways; not the least to the printers, and to the valued local friend, who so willingly and so carefully fills the office of proof reader for me.

More than my best I could not do, the result must speak for itself; though every effort has been used to prevent errors, some will doubtless be pointed out by readers.

The faults of omission and commission are freely offered to those critics who may think they could the better have done this editorial task, which has occupied fifteen months of continuous, but pleasant labour on my part.
