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#### PREFACE

A comprehensive history of the origin and tenets of the General Baptist movement and of the gradual development of a number of their churches into Unitarianism has yet to be written.

The student who might be inclined to attempt this task would find himself beset with many difficulties. Records relating to the subject are dispersed. Some are in private hands. Most are in manuscript and often time-consuming to decipher.

Where such records have been catalogued or printed, the work of the student will be eased and his effectiveness enhanced. Much has been done in this way already but a large gap remains. The purpose of this volume, and such others as may follow, is to help fill this gap.

It is hoped also that the volume may serve to stimulate the interest of those who attend the Old Meeting House at Ditchling or other Sussex chapels of General Baptist origin, and that it will help them to sense something of the piety of their spiritual ancestors who built and sustained their places of worship under conditions so very different from our own.

#### INTRODUCTION

Three Memorandum Books relating to the Meeting House at Ditchling and the congregation it served are transcribed in this volume.

The first and earliest known surviving book was begun in 1753 and records church meetings from that date till 1803. Also in the book, written from the other end, is a list of baptisms from 1737 onwards. The entries up to 1760 are all written by the same hand which suggests that they were copied from another document which has not come down to us.

The second book carries on from 1803. It follows the same general pattern initially but its character gradually changes. The erratic spelling of the first book disappears and the writers of the records begin to appear as men of some education. Visiting preachers begin to come from more distant places than hitherto, no doubt due to the rise of the stage coaches and later of the railways.

By the time the third book begins in 1867 there has been a profound change in character. The principal families are obviously more prosperous but no longer live primarily 'in and about Ditchling'. Attendance at services is down and funds are inadequate to sustain a regular minister. As the book closes the meetings are dominated by a trivial squabble over the replacement of the defective organ by a harmonium.

In transcribing the books the manuscript has been followed as far as practicable. The spelling as written has been retained throughout. Abbreviations such as Jn<sup>2</sup>, which do not lend themselves to reproduction by typescript, have been simplified to Jon. etc.

The list of baptisms has been somewhat simplified as compared with the manuscript in the first book. The list has also been extended using information taken from the text of the second book. Again the manuscript spelling has been used even where it may be known to be incorrect from signatures elsewhere.

Facsimile reproductions of a few pages from the first book have been included for general interest. Also, for convenient reference, a general index is included at the end of the volume.

The transcriber wished to thank his fellow Trustee, Mr. P.W. Sinden, for permission to use his sketch of the Meeting House as a frontispiece to this volume.

The volume has been reproduced direct from the transcriber's typescript using ordinary office document copying equipment. It is hoped it will not prove an undue strain upon the eyesight of the reader.

The books are normally to be found in the strong room at Essex Hall, Essex Street, London.

#### Church Meeting May 12 1833 Mr Browne in the Chair

Mr Withall, having been requested by the Committee the Sunday previous to draw up a letter from this Church to the Assembly, read one which he had prepared and which was adopted & signed by several members for the Congregation Mr Browne then read the minutes of meetings held during the year past. It was then Resolved

- That Mr Henry Marten & Mr James Turner Senr (in place of P. Howland Jr & Mr. Hollingham who have served two years) do serve on the Committee with Mr. Jon Wood & Mr. Jesse Kensett for the year ensuing.

- 3. That Mr Browne be requested to keep the Chapel in repair
- 4. That Mr Withall & Mr Kensett represent this Church at the Assembly.
- 5. That Mr. Withall make the Annual Collection for the Punds.

#### Annual Meeting 19 May 1833

Rev. Benjamin Mardon of Worship Street London preached both times to good congregations. In the Afternoon Revd J.P. Malleson of Brighton conducted the devotional part of the Service.

In the Evening about 160 persons partook of Tea in the Chapel & the Meeting concluded with Singing a Hymn. Mr Malleson & Mr Mardon left, to go to Brighton before the Tea.

#### Church Meeting Sunday Afternoon Feb 9, 1834

Mr Withall signified his intention to resign his office of Minister at the end of March next after which time he and the Congregation would be at liberty to make any new arrangements.

Resolved that another Church Necting be convened this day 4 weeks - for the purpose of ascertaining what new arrangements it is desirable & practicable to make.

# Church Meeting held 9th March 1834

Mr Jesse Kensett in the Chair

The Treasurer (Mr Wood) having laid the list of Subscribers to the Chapel, before the Meeting from which it appears that the sum of £39=4/ is already prosised & the probability of obtaining some assistance from Funds available in such cases being suggested - Mr Withall expressed his willingness to continue his Services to the Congregation if £50 per annum can be raised for his support.

Proposed by Mr Wood & seconded by Mr Edward Turner & carried unanimously; That Mr Withall be engaged to continue as Minister to the Congregation; and in the event of a Separation being desired three months notice be given by either party.

Proposed by Mr Feter Rowland & seconded by Mr Edward Turner & carried unanimously: That Mr Wood be requested to keep the Chapel & Scats in repair.

Proposed by Mr Wood & seconded by Mr Chatfield that a Copy of the Title Deeds of the Chapel be purchased of Mr John Browns & that Miss Browns be requested to make application for the same - carried unanimously.

#### Church Meeting May 4th 1834

Proposed by Mr Chatfield, seconded by Mr Rowland Jnr & carried unarimously That Mr E. Turner be chosen upon the Chapel Committee for the ensuing year, in room of Mr Jesse Kensett who goes out by rotation.

Proposed by Mr Hollingham, Seconded by Mr Jesse Kensett & Carried unanimously That Mr John Burtenshaw be chosen upon the Chapel Committee for the ensuing year.

Mr Withall was requested to make the Annual Collection for the Funds - And to prepare a Letter to the Assembly - to be submitted to the members next Sunday Morning

#### 11 May 1834

Notice being given, Mr Withall read the letter to the Assembly which he had prepared - which was approved & signed by several persons present.

# Annual Meeting

Mr R.K. Philip of London (City Missionary) preached twice & presided at the Communion.

In the Evening about 140 persons took tea in the Chapel - after which Mr Henry Browne of Lewes & Mr Philip both addressed the Meeting.

The Company separated about 6 o Clock - about 150 persons partock of Tea

#### August 21 1836

A Committee was called at which Mr Withall stated that on account of present debility he feels it necessary to suspend preaching until he acquires greater strength - he therefore recommends the making an application to Mr Bankhead of Brighton to supply for a time on Sunday mornings and is continuing the Afternoon Service during that time

The Committee acceeded to this recommendation directing Mr W to make the necessary application

Note. Mr W, having been unable to obtain the assistance of Mr Bankhead, conducted morning Service only for 4 or 5 Sundays, when he was able to resume the Afternoon Service in addition to it

#### October 2nd 1836

It was agreed that inquiry should be made respecting the Charges in other burial grounds, to form our own list by. Mr Wood undertook to ask what it is at the Church.

4th That no Charge be made for the Interment of Subscribers

5th That the Committee have power to allow the Poor who attend the Chapel to be interred free of expence

6th That the Money arising from the above charges be paid to the Congregational Fund.

Hr J Turner stated in reply that Hr Tarrant wrote for the first refusal of the organ, it was offered him at his own valuation of £20 - which offer he declined; the sale was then put into the hards of Er Stares of Lewes, who advertised & sold the organ for £10. Hr R Turner wrote to Hr Stares, stating that the sale was not authorised by the Chapel Committee; the purchaser was informed of this & refused to have the organ. A gentleman from Brighton wrote about it but it was too high for his room.

It was then sold to Mr Stares for £2 - which money I, as Treasurer hold & consider that the congregation has a claim on Mr R Turner for £8 which through him was lost. I think the money received for the organ should be paid to the ministers fund.

Proposed by Miss Turner & seed by Miss Rowland that the money received for the organ be paid into the ministers fund.

# LIST OF BAPTISMS and of others admitted to Church Membership (see page 46 heretofore)

When the record opens in 1737 admission to Church Rembership was confined strictly to those duly baptised or recommended by Churches of similar faith elsewhere.

The first mention of admission without heptism is on May 17th 1801, evidently referring to a Mr Victor whose admission was agreed the following year. Strangely, his mane does not appear in the list of admissions in the memorandum book.

Nothing more is recorded of this Kr Vidler. Fouribly he was William Vidler, then nearing the end of his lively ministry at Parliament Court Recting in Bishopsgate, but this is shear conjecture.

The natter arose again in 1811 when his Hannah Harten sought simission without baptism. She was, presumably, the former Hannah Burtensnaw who had married Henry Marten of Newland, Keymer.

It must have been a turning point in the life of the church community that a member of a family which had been one of the pillars of the old church order should have made such an application. She was, nevertheless, duly admitted without serious opposition.

The last reference to any baptism occurs on June 3rd 1832.

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## PREFACE

This volume has been prepared to assist students of this and future generations who may be studying the history of the Old Meeting House at Ditchling, the genealogy of their families or other related matters.

As more information comes to light so the volume may need to be amended or extended. This the compiler hopes to do if needed. The present volume should thus be considered an interim one.

The compiler would welcome advice from any reader who has additional information on the subject and which might serve to make a future edition more useful.

It is hoped that such a future edition will be supplemented by genealogical trees of the larger families whose names appear in its pages. Substantial progress has been made in the compilation of these trees, but they are at present insufficiently complete to warrant publication with this volume.

INTRODUCTION

Most of the persons whose names appear in the records which follow were members, or descendants of members of what was once a relatively closed community. To understand why this community existed and why these people chose to belong to such a community, it is necessary to look back into history.

The early years of the reign of Queen Elizabeth were ones of stability and consolidation. The Church had been rid of its worst corruption and superstition in the time of her father, had swung to one extreme, so it was argued, in the reign of her brother, had swung to the opposite extreme under her sister to the revulsion of most people in the country, but was now treading a steady middle path. The Book of Common Prayer had been re-established and had found general acceptance. The Bible, now widely available, was having a profound influence on the people who regarded it as the ultimate measure of what was right and wrong in things spiritual. The Government was firm, and if justice was a little rough at times, the fears of enemies abroad and conspiracy at home rendered it acceptable.

Such conditions could not last as the country became more settled. The revulsion against the spiritual bondage of the past was deeply ingrained in many people, lay and clergy. They saw the pride and wealth of the bishops, the vestments of the Church, and many passages in the Book of Common Prayer as savouring of popery.

The more thoughtful clergy, commonly known as 'Puritans', began to give no more than lip service to the church establishment. They preached without vestments. They baptised without the sign of the cross.

When John Whitgift was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury he had a firm directive from the Queen to enforce conformity. The Puritan party came under persecution, but to no avail, for two generations later their strength had grown such that crown and bishops were swept away.

There were some clergy whose minds followed a more radical path. Whereas the Puritans sought to purify rather than destroy the Church of England, these other minds, by dint of deep study of the bible, found no scriptural authority for an established church. Moreover they found many of the practices of the church as contravening the scriptures.

They concluded that when two or more were gathered together in the name of Jesus Christ, there was the true church. It was that church and no other, that should appoint Elders for their spiritual uplifting, Deacons for their temporal support, and Messengers for spreading the Gospel.

Some took a step further. Admission to the true church could only be as a result of belief in the teachings of Jesus, repentence for past sins and the washing away of those sins by baptism. Baptism of infants was meaningless and without any scriptural authority.

Such people were originally called 'Anabaptists' as a mark of derision though, in time, they accepted the name 'Baptists'.

At that time the teaching of Calvin was becoming widely accepted throughout much of Europe and England. It taught, amongst other things, that salvation was limited to a predestined few and that the bulk of mankind was lost through the sins of Adam. Most Baptists found this view quite unacceptable. They considered salvation was available to all and general who diligently sought it. From this tenet they became known as 'General Baptists' and it is from these that the Ditchling Meeting House people trace their origin.

Baptists suffered much persecution, both the General Baptists and those who held to the Calvinist view and were known as 'Particular Baptists'. Those caught practising adult baptism risked imprisonment or even death. The hoped/for improvement in these conditions on the death of Elizabeth failed to materialise. A number fled to Holland and it was in Amsterdam in about 1609 that the first English Baptist Church was formally constituted.

A few years later, uneasy at the thought of accepting a safe refuge rather than facing troubles at home, the church leaders returned to England oventually to die in prison. Not till the time of the Civil War did conditions in England allow Baptists and others separated from the Church of England to worship in peace. Sadly, with the restoration of Charles II, persecution began once more. It was not till the Glorious

Revolution of 1688 which placed William and Mary on the throne that religous persecution virtually came to an end.

Persecution for 100 years or so had left its mark on the Baptists, as with others. Secrecy of worship had been essential for long periods. Any stranger might be an informer. Thus the custom arose of intermarriage between Baptist families, a custom often enforced by threat of exclusion from their communion.

The records which follow, even though relating mainly to persons living long after persecution had ceased, still show extensive intermarriage between the old families, at least up to the early 1800s by which time the old customs had almost died.

So too by then had some of the old beliefs. From its inception the movement had a strong aversion to any written creed or statement of faith other than in the most general terms. Their only authority was the written word of the bible and this, in strict terms, meant the Greek and Hebrew originals. As modern biblical criticism arose so their approach to the bible was affected. Some, troubled by the new thinking, had moved to Methodism or across to the Particular Baptists. Some, despairing of the religous and political climate in England had moved to America. Others,

no longer influenced by the troubles of the past and following the pressures attendant upon growing prosperity, reverted to the Church of England.

The remainder, following a rational path as they saw it, developed into Unitarianism.

The Meeting House still has no credal basis for membership. While it seeks new light from whatever direction it may come, it honours its founders and those who have sustained its witness in and about Ditchling over the centuries and many of whose bodies lie in the burial grounds which surround it.

It is to the memory of these people that this volume is dedicated.

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#### RECISTER OF BIRTES

In the 17th century Parish Registers tended to be records of baptisms rather than of births. The General Reptists did not practise infant baptism. There was a reductance amongst some Parish Clergy to enter births into their registers even when requested to do so. The result was that in the early days of dissent few records of births were kept other than in family bibles or journals.

As difficulties arose the inevitable consequence was the creation of non-parochial registers of various kinds. The Borsham Meeting began their own Register in 1724, accepting entries from all who so requested including a few entries from Ditchling. Another such Begister was that kept by Dr Williams's Library.

The keeping of a Hegister of Births for the Ditchling Meeting seems to have been first raised in 1785 when it was missited:

" Agreed that a Book be bought to Register Childrens Hanes in when Born - To be done by H Browns "

No action was taken possibly due to Henry Browne being precocupied with the setting up of a business in Lewes with his partner William Crosskey. Again in 1791 it was minuted:

" It is the wish of this Meeting that a Book be bought to register Childrens masses in - they have therefore appointed Jan Browne to procure the case and execute the business "

James Browne, a younger brother of Henry, was Secretary to the Meeting. Still no action was taken.

In 1805 Abraham Bennett, former Minister of the General Baptist Meeting in Bishopagate, was appointed Mider. It was he who, in 1811, began the Register. Dis first entries were those of his children born some years earlier.

Following the departure of Fir. Bennott to a ministry at Foole and the brief ministry of William Browne, the Begister was taken over by James Browne. He made some amends for his earlier inactivity by gathering and entering details of some earlier births and thereafter keeping the Begister with his customary care. George Withall was appointed Minister in 1852 for by this time the term 'Elder' had been quietly dropped. Thereafter the Register was in his hands though few entries were made.

In 1837 there came into operation the Act of 3 & 4 Vict cap 92 relative to the General Registration of Births. Narriages and Deaths. Amongst the provisions of this Act, all non-parcohial registers were to be deposited in the General Register Office. This was duly done and the Ditchling Register of Births is now to be found in the Public Hecord Office, manuscript HG4 1795.

The Register is a large book. Nost of the pages are unused. On the flyleaf is pasted a Return evidently made before it, along with the Deaths Register, was deposited. In the Return, George Withall certifies, inter alias

' I am the Minister of the General Buptist Chapel Ditchling

The principal acting trustees are John Wood, Jeage Ecnaett, Edward Turner, all of Ditchling

The Register of Burials at the Burial Ground of the General Baptist Chapel, Cuckfield has been kept by Mr James Walder of Long Acre House, Cuckfield

A copy of the Seginter was made before the original was deposited. This copy has survived though in a scuewhat mutilated condition. So subsequent Register was kept. The new Act rendered it unnecessary.

In making the transcription of the Register of Births some simplification of format has been adopted together with nome abbreviations, vis:

- Hegistered by Dr VL Registered at Dr Williams's Library
- AB Abrahem Boxmett )
- William Browne ) Protestant Dissenting GW George Withall ) Ministers
- JB James Browne

The Register entries are numbered 1 to 62 but with a gap between 16 and 25. The last entry was in 1832. The entries appear to cover only a small proportion of the births of children to members of the Church.

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#### REGISTER OF DEATHS AND BURLALS.

This has been compiled from a number of sources.

Firstly there is the Register covering the preied 1821 to 1837 which was deposited in the General Register Office along with the Register of Births under the 1837 Act and now held by the Public Record Office, Document No RG4 1797. The 68 entries in this Register have been transcribed using a simplified format as was done for the Register of Births.

Secondly there is an additional Register held in the Meeting House archives (MS DL6). It begins with a copy of the 68 entries of the original Hegister and then carries on, the last entry being dated Pebruary 1950.

This second Register bears the imprint of many hands, both in the original entries and in corrections or additions added by later hands. The title of the Register changes as time goes on. The original flyleaf reads:

'Amerister of Ditchling General Suptist Chapel Surials' The outer cover, in a later hand reads:

'Register of Chapel Burials'

A later brown paper dust cover bears the title:

\*Ditchling Free Christian Church Burials\*

There are a number of gaps in the Register suggreting that it was lost or was inaccessable to those officiating at funerals for some periods. Some of the gaps were noted in a list in the handwriting of Miss Smily Cooke entitled 'Burials not entered in Register - On Stones' (MS BL99) and citing 24 masss.

For once of reference this information has been added to the Register as transcribed, in date order and marked \*.

No attempt has been made to add details of Deaths and Purials before 1821 when the original Register was started. Where such information is available, it will be found in the Register of Graves and Nonumental Inscriptions or the Supplementary List which follow.

MONUMENTAL INSCRIPTIONS

The Register which follows has been compiled from four principal sources:

- a) A plan of the Hoeting House and Burial Grounds prepared at the time of the creation of the 1834 Trust Deed together with a partly completed Schedule of those persons buried in the Old Burial Ground MI DLS3
- b) A ponnil sketch, undated, by an unknown hand and entitled 'The Floor of the Chapel before being boarded' and giving come details of the grave stones exposed at that time NS DL48
- c) A record of gravestone inscriptions compiled by Mine Unily Cooke (1852-1921) from personal observation and using an earlier record of inscriptions made by Colonel F W T Attree. This record was loaned to the Transcriber by her kingwoman Miss Jessie Read. It is referred to hereafter as MS DL107
- d) A visual check of all surviving gravestones and accordal tablets by the Transcriber and members of his family

The numbering system used to identify graves in the Old Burial Ground is that found in the 1854 plan. Elsewhere the numbering system is that of the Transcriber. A plan at the end of this volume locates the position of each individual grave by number.

The Durish Register, up to 1937 and when referring to the New Burial Ground, generally locates the grave by the distance in feet/inches from the East and South walls. When referring to the latter, it should be recembered that, in 1949 the South wall was moved come 12 feet or so right up to the boundary of the property

#### SUPPLEMENTARY LIST

From even a cursitory examination of the foregoing registers it is apparent that many names are minning. The registers were started fairly late in the life of the Church. The entries bear evidence of being somewhat spaceholde at times. The names of the occupants of a number of identified graves are unknown.

A number of dates of births, deaths or burisls appear in other records. Where these are such as to suggest they would have been included in the registers but for the reasons cited above, they have been brought together into this Supplementary List.

In the course of the studies leading up to the compilation of this present work, details have come to light of a large number of persons related by family to many of those whose names appear in the registers. So attempt has been made to include them in the Supplementary Lint. They will be found in a subsequent Volume yet to be prepared covering Genealogies of the larger families associated with the Ditchling and sister Heetings of General Baptist origin.





#### INTRODUCTION

For those readers unfamiliar with the history of the meeting house it may be said that it was built to serve a community of people who described themselves in their Church Book as:

'The Church of our Lord Jesus Christ; Meeting in and about Ditcheling, in the County of Sussex'

They were a group of General Baptists meeting together in strict communion whereby only those who had been baptised in accordance with their customs could be admitted to membership of their Church.

The people who now worship in the meeting house give themselves no such title and adopt no such practices. They might, to the casual observer, appear in no way descended spiritually or by family from the original community.

Yet, on closer examination, one can find no sudden or dramatic changes which came over the community at any time. The change has been gradual. And where specific decisions were taken from time to time, and now seen by us as milestones in their development, such decisions were seen at the time as doing little more than confirming attitudes and practices already long accepted.

Gradual changes were facilitated as there was a long tradition of tolerance for those with differing ideas. Thus, at the end of the 18th century, whilst one preacher might expound Unitarian views, another might preach the traditional message and administer the rite of adult baptism and laying on of hands at the baptistory conveniently exposed by removable floorboards in the meeting house.

So too the meeting house itself has seen changes of name, from The Baptist Meeting House, The Unitarian Baptist Congregation, The Free Christian Church and more recently, simply, The Old Meeting House.

#### THE TRUST DEEDS

The group of Deeds here transcribed cover the acquisition of the cottage and grounds on which the meeting house was built a few years earlier, a further piece of ground known as the new burial ground, and the purchase of a slip of ground which now forms part of the footpath known as The Twitten. The Deeds contain provisions for the appointment of new Trustees from time to time together with a Declaration of Trust as to the purposes for which the property is intended to be used.

The Declaration of Trust is unusual though by no means unique. It merely states that the Trustees will apply the property to such charitable uses as they shall, in their judgement and discretion, think most proper. There is no mention of a place of worship nor of the General Baptist persuasion of its founders.

The reasons for this open trust are not difficult to guess. The Baptists had suffered perhaps more than any other sect. Their rejection of infant baptism was abhorrent to Anglican and Presbyterian alike. Both had persecuted them in their time. It was well within living memory that their sectings had to be held in secrecy within private houses.

# 1740 Deeds

On 30th April there was executed the Feoffment whereby Robert Chatfield (1705-1741) obtained the freehold of the property which had previously been held by him copyhold from the Lord of the Manor of Camois Court, John Lucas. His intention was to comply with the Will of his father Robert Chatfield (1675-1736) whereby he was requested to make a good title to Stephen Agate and others to the meeting house and burial ground.

On the following day, May 1st, there was executed an Indenture conveying the property to John Dancy and eleven others, subject to a Declaration of Trust and the consideration of ten shillings, a modest sum compared with the three pounds and three shillings which Robert Chatfield had paid for the freehold on the previous day. As John Lucas and his steward Thomas Attree witnessed the Deed, one may guess that John Lucas was not unsympathetic to the whole transaction.

## 1758 Deed

The reason for creating this Indenture is not apparent. Possibly the 1740 Deed was temporarily mislaid. Possibly there was some doubt as to its legality. No correspondence on the matter has come down to us. By this Deed, Joseph Chatfield (1737-1784),

the only surviving son of Robert (1705-1741), conveyed the whole of the property to 15 new Trustees, including all the then surviving 1740 Trustees, using substantially similar wording to that of the 1740 Deed. Again the sum of ten shillings is mentioned, doubtless for legal reasons, for the Chatfield family were generous benefactors to the Church.

## 1790 Deed

By 1790 only two of the 1758 Trustees remained alive and a new Deed became necessary. New names appear. A large proportion of the new Trustees come from Cuckfield and Lewes. From Ditchling comes, amongst others, the lay preacher and diarist John Burgess.

## 1821 Deeds

The old burial ground had by this time become very crowded. Steps had been taken from time to time to acquire more ground. The land to the east of the meeting house was owned by the Chatfield family. In 1821 it was in the hands of Robert Chatfield (1755-1821) who, incidentally, spelt his name Chatfield. His elder brother John (1749-1828) had built a free school for boys at the northern end of the ground abutting East End Lane in 1814. Robert had added a room for girls in 1815. The rest was used as a playground for , the children.

It was the latter piece of ground which Robert finally agreed to sell to the meeting house Trustees. This was effected by the two Deeds, a one year lease and an outright sale of the land for twenty six pounds. The conveyance was to the surviving 1790 Trustees, of which nine were still alive. Robert Chatfield died shortly afterwards and was one of the first to be intered in the new burisl ground.

# 1822 Purchase

In order to preserve a right of way from East End Lane into the new burial ground, a slip of land was purchased by James Browne, on behalf of the Trustees, from Stephen Andrews, evidently a blacksmith. His land abutted the new burial ground to the east and as far south as the private burial ground of the Browne family. The receipt for the two pounds purchase money is dated Feb 9th 1822. No formal conveyance has come to light. This slip of land is now, as mentioned above, part of The Twitten.

One must suspect the two pounds came from the pocket of James Browne (1774-1834). He was treasurer of the meeting house for 40 years. His brother, father and two uncles had been Trustees in their time. James Browne was successful in his business in Ditchling as a Draper, coupled with dealings in property. Though a little autocratic at times, he was a loyal and generous supporter of the meeting house and the larger General Baptist movement. He was keenly interested in the free school and bought the buildings after the death of John Chatfield in 1828 rather than allow the school to close. Most of the meeting house business was in his hands. Though not a Trustee himself, his sudden death caused the congregation to seek new Trustee appointments.

# 1834 Deed

By this time there were only three surviving 1790 Trustees. They appointed 22 new Trustees including the 19 year old William Kensett and James Turner the younger, a wise choice as it proved later.

A plan was made of the burial grounds indicating all known graves together with a schedule of occupants. Though not incorporated into the Deed, the plan has survived and has proved invaluable in the preparation of the register of graves published in 1978.

It is curious that the description of the property conveyed under the 1834 Deed still follows the 1740 description. It makes no reference to the existance of the meeting house. It still refers to the land as being a rood by estimation. Only the description of the north boundary has been changed, and this somewhat vaguely, to take account of the acquisition of the new burial ground. The east boundary is described as if the footpath acquired in 1822 is outside the property.

## 1886 Deed

This Deed seems to have been drawn up by someone with an imperfect understanding of the provisions of the Act of 1850 (13 & 14 Vic. c.28). Under this Act a form of appointment of new Trustees was given for use in cases where there was no existing power of appointment. In 1886 there were two surviving 1834 Trustees, James Turner treasurer and William Kensett secretary of the Chapel.

The Chapel Minute Book of that time shows clearly that the new appointments were made with the full approval of the two surviving 1854 Trustees. It may thus be argued that, though the Deed was theoretically invalid at the time, it has never been seriously challenged and that, whatever deficiencies there were, time has served to render irrelevant. The Deed is now deemed quite valid.

## 1922 Doed

Seven of the 1886 Trustees were alive in 1922. Evidently with their full concurrence, twelve additional Trustees were appointed, again using the 1886 form of appointment with its doubtful validity at the time. The new Trustees were all members of the families of the existing Trusteen or well known supporters of the Unitarian movement. The only curious thing is that no member of the congregation regularly meeting at Ditchling at that time was appointed to the Trust.

The British & Foreign Unitarian Association now appears as a Trustee. The intention was, doubtless, that they should be Custodian Trustee though this was not specifically stated.

# 1963 Deed

By 1944 the congregation became concerned that so few of the 1922 Trustees were still living and even fewer had any contact with the Chapel. Liscussions were opened for the creation of a new Trust Deed but were not persued largely due to the backlog of similar situations elsewhere and resulting from the difficulties of the war years. The Custodian Trustee was disinclined to do other than tackle the more urgent cases first. Ditchling did not appear to be one. It was not till 1963 that positive steps were taken and a new Deed was created, again using the 1886 form of memorandum.

In the years that followed and for various reasons it became necessary to demonstrate the title of the Trustees to the property. The issue was a little clouded. Some of the original Deeds could not be found. Doubts were raised as to whether all of the surviving 1922 Trustees had been traced and their wishes sought before the 1963 Deed was executed. Further, the validity of the form of memorandum used was again questioned.

It was concluded that the validity of the 1965 Deed could not be upheld and that a new Deed was required. All the 1922 Trustees must be traced. Thorough research was put in hand and it was

found that, by 1974, the only living 1922 Trustees were Mrs Eathleen Ruth Burnett-Hall, daughter of Alfred Wilson and her cousin Arthur Keith Wilson.

# 1975 Deeda

Two new Deeds were drawn up. In the one, ten additional Trustees were appointed and Arthur Keith Wilson retired. In the other the British & Foreign Unitarian Association was formally appointed Custodian Trustee thus regularising its somewhat vague position in the 1922 Deed.

At the time of drafting of the 1975 Deeds, some of the original Deeds were still missing. For the purpose of drafting resort had to be had to what were believed to be copies of missing Deeds. Subsequent research produced all the missing Deeds and at the same time confirming the accuracy of the copies used hitherto.

The title to the Meeting House, the adjoining cottage and the burial grounds may now be regarded as in good order.

## Transcripts of the Deeds

The transcripts or abstracts of the various Deeds which follow have been made from the originals, all of which are now in the custody of the Custodian Trustee at Essex Hall, Essex Street, London.

#### THE TRUSTEES

We have little factual information about the early Trustees. Research may yet shed more light on them but for the purpose of this note some conjecture must be resorted to.

At least of this we can be reasonably sure. All of the early Trustees came from families already long associated with the General Baptist movement. At a period when absence from public worship or marriage outside the Baptist community brought the risk of excommunication, movement into or out of community must have been somewhat restricted.

The origins of the Baptist community which ultimately gathered together to build the Ditchling Meeting House are obscure. The Baptist movement was clearly flourishing during the civil war. The Baptist element in the army of Gromwell was sufficiently large to require strong measures to curtail its political aspirations.

The mists surrounding the community begin to clear by the middle of the reign of Charles II. Notwithstanding the Act of Uniformity of 1662 and subsequent penal legislation, the suppression of dissent from the Established Church was only partly effective. Returns were called for in 1669 so as to establish how many conventicles there were in the country. Prom these returns come the first names. In the house of James Wood of Twineham were found about 40 'Anabaptists and Quakers' under their teachers Michael Martyn and others unknown. At Ditchling were found 10 Anabaptists but their teachers unknown.

In 1672 Charles issued his Declaration of Indulgence and invited applications for the issue of licences for dissenting places of worship. His intentions were dubious to say the least and Parliament eventually quashed the Declaration. Meantime some applications were made and amongst these was one from Robert Marchant for a meeting at his house in Ditchling.

Here, by family names, appear the first links with the 1740 Trustees. Robert Chatfield himself was the son of the former Sarah Marten and she the daughter of the former Elizabeth Marchant. The Woods of Twineham and their relatives remained staunch supporters of the meetings at Ditchling and Hornham until almost within living memory.

# POOTPATH TO THE NEW BURIAL GROUND (THE TWITTEN)

When the Meeting House was built the entrance door was on the north side. The level of East End Lame was lower than the land either side so that access to the Meeting House must have been either across the steeply rising burial ground or by an adjoining footpath then running south from East End Lane along the edge of an open field called Gunufield. Access for burial carts seems to have been from the south along the footpath and into the burial ground at a point where the newer part of the cottage now stands.

Ounsfield was owned by Joseph Locker. In 1747 he gave it to his daughter Lacy who had married Michael Chatfield. So long as the Locker or Chatfield families held Gansfield no access problems arcse. But the death of Robert Chatfield in 1821, the failing health of his brother John, and the fact that the rest of the family no longer lived anywhere near Ditchling, rendered change of ownership inevitable.

It was thus very prudent of James Browne to negotiate the purchase of a slip of land to the east so as to ensure permunent access both to the new burial ground and to the private burial ground of his family.

Just when the old footpath was closed is not clear. Funeral carts were still using the path up to 1842 when the new owners desied further access for carts. Possibly it was then, if not earlier, that the footpath was switched from the west to the east side of Omsfield, this part of the field now isolated by the new Leves Road and known as Burnt House Plot. The alignment of the southerly part of the Twitten as it now stands seems to confirm this speculation.

To effect a neat junction between the two sections of the footpath, small slipe of ground seem to have been given up by both burial grounds as well as by the property owner to the east of the junction.

A full story of the Twitten awaits research.

#### INTRODUCTION

The Deeds relating to the Old Meeting House Trust Property were transcribd and published privately in April 1979 as Volume III of the 'Records of the Old Meeting House. Ditchling'. This work covered all the Deeds executed from the original Feofiment and Declaration of Trust of 1740 to the Appointment of New Trustees in 1975.

Across The Twitten from the Meeting House is what is known as 'The Browne Burial Ground'. It was originally set aside by Peter Browne (1688-1774) from his freehold land to serve as a burial place for members of his family. At that time the Meeting House grounds were small and space for burials was very limited.

Peter Browne and his family were staunch supporters of the Church which met for worship in the Meeting House and so they continued till about 50 years ago. By then death and dispersal of the family had almost severed the link. Since then only Leon and Violet Charman, both descended from Peter Browne, and some descendants from America ever visited the ground.

The care of the ground gradually fell upon the Meeting House Congregation and their friends. Finally as Leon Charman neared the end of his life he indicated his wish that ownership of the ground should be transferred to the Meeting House Trustees.

No Title Deed could be found, nor was it practical to trace all the living heirs-at-law of Peter Browne. The only reasonable solution appeared to be for the Meeting House Trustees to assume possession of the ground by Statutory Declaration with the concurrence all known descendants of Peter Browne.

This concurrence Leon Charman duly obtained. He also generously gave to the Trustees certain funds to help cover the cost of future maintenance of the ground.

The position was duly regularised by the execution of the appropriate statutory Declarations followed by the execution of a Deed of 22nd April 1983 the effect of which was to incorporate the Browne Burial Ground into the Meeting House Trust Property. By the same Deed one Trustee retired at her request and three additional Trustees were appointed.

It is a transcription of these Deeds which forms the subject of this present work.
